2024 GPA Award Winner

We are pleased to present the second winner of the 2024 GPA Award. Junbin Yang impressed the GPA Award judges with his paper entitled "Muddying the Waters of Normalized Bodies: Toward a Rhizomatic Assemblage that Matters."

Junbin Yang is a doctoral student in the Physical Cultural Studies research group in the Kinesiology Department at the University of Maryland, where he received his M.A. in 2022. His thesis (re)interpreted Manuel DeLanda's assemblage theory, by synthesizing the theory and the ideas of conjuncture and articulation, and explored three conjunctural moments in South Korea, including a longstanding period of totalitarian regimes, national economic crisis, and contemporary society. Before coming to Maryland, Junbin previously worked as a journalist for several newspapers in Seoul, focusing on topics such as post-utilization plans of stadiums after the 2018 PyeongChang Olympic Games, and the relationship between the entertainment and sport industry. Junbin's research interests broadly include sport and politics, the globalization of sport and physical culture, mega-sporting events, disability studies, and assemblage thinking. His current projects include explorations of neoliberalism and its emotional impacts, the rise of conservative parties and political polarization, and the Olympic Games and electronic surveillance systems. Primarily drawing on a qualitative approach, Junbin's research aims to discover different possibilities in particular empirical sites, and illuminate dominant/overlooked elements at play in society that enable and/or constrain prominent and unseen individuals and entities.

An Interview with Vladislav I. Stolyarov

Historical experience of cooperation through the sociology of sports: An interview with Professor Vladislav Stolyarov

In conversation with *Aleksandr S. Gonashvili*.



4 - Vladislav I. Stolyarov

Vladislav I. Stolyarov — Doctor of Philosophy, Professor of the Federal State Budgetary Educational Institution of Higher Education RSUFKSMiT and FGBI VNIIFK — was born on February 4, 1937. He graduated from the Faculty of Philosophy of Lomonosov Moscow State University (1959), and held an impressive range of research and senior posts at prestigious academic institutions, such as the Institute of Philosophy of the USSR Academy of Sciences (1959-1971), the State Institute of Physical Culture (1972-2006), the Philosophical Society of the USSR (1986-1989), the Spartina Humanist Center, the Coordinating Commission of the Scientific Council of the USSR State Sports Committee on philosophical and sociological problems of physical culture and sports. He also founded an innovative Russian school of philosophical and sociological analysis of physical culture, sports, and Olympism from the standpoint of humanism underpinned by dialectical methodology.

For 12 years he was a member of the Bureau of the International Committee for the Sociology of Sport and the editorial board of the International Journal of the Sociology of Sport. He has been a member of the Olympic Committee for more than 10 years.

What attracted you to the sociology of sport?

1972 I moved to the State Central Order of Lenin Institute of Physical Culture.

From 1972 to 1991 I was a head of an international group of scientists from Bulgaria, Hungary, GDR, Poland, USSR, Czechoslovakia on philosophical and sociological problems of physical culture and sport. The main topic of the joint international research was philosophical and sociological problems on the theme: "Sport, way of life, culture". Our work straddled philosophy and sociology, theoretical and empirical developments and focused on the broad themes of sport and physical culture as a way of life, with a specific focus on women, children and young people, healthy lifestyles, all in the context of socialism.

In addition, from 1983 to 1992 I was a head of the research on the philosophical and sociological problems of physical culture and sport in our country. During this period several sociological studies I led a number of significant studies, notably:

- A study commissioned in 2007 by the Federal Agency for Education on the topic «Tracking the degree of satisfaction of students in educational institutions with the level of organization of physical education classes. Development of recommendations». A survey of students and physical education teachers in general education schools was conducted. The sample included 24 subjects of the Russian Federation from 7 federal districts. The results of the study are presented in the collective monograph: Modernization of physical education in secondary schools / V.I. Stolyarov, V.K. Balsevich, V.P. Mochenov, L.I. Lubysheva ; edited by Prof. V.I. Stolyarov. - Moscow : Scientific and Publishing Center «Theory and Practice of Physical Culture», 2009. - 320 p.
- A study in 2018 on the topic «Physical culture and sports activity of preschoolers». The results are presented in the monograph: Stolyarov V.I., Okunkov Y.V. Modern problems of physical culture and sports activity of preschoolers: sociological analysis / edited by Prof. V.I. Stolyarov. - Moscow : Sport, 2019. - 320 p.

Since 2018 I have been acting as an expert in large-scale sociological studies conducted annually in our country to identify the factors that promote or, on the contrary, hinder physical culture and sports activity of the population, as well as forms and methods to increase it. Surveys of the population in 85 subjects of the Russian Federation are conducted by the Federal Science Center of Physical Culture and Sport (FSC VNIIFK) in cooperation with specialists from Russian Public Opinion Research Center, Russian State Social University and National Research University – Higher School of Economics. Several reports were written in collaboration with colleague from the Federal Science Center of Physical Culture and Sport,

What memories do you have of the International Sociology of Sport Association?

I participated in the activities of the International Sociology of Sport Association, was member of the editorial board of the journal of this association, and also an author of articles in this journal during the above-mentioned period from 1972 to 1991,

I have the best memories of my cooperation with the philosophers and sociologists not only from Bulgaria, Hungary, GDR, Poland, Czechoslovakia (such as Z. Krawczyk, A. Wohl, T. Feldeschi, J. Mergautova), but also from other countries. First of all, I would like to mention such philosophers and sociologists as G. Lenk, G. Luchen, P. McIntosh, R. Naul, R. Seppänen. K. Heinemann, K. Heinila, S. Güldenpfennig. At numerous international conferences (including those held annually by our international group of philosophers and sociologists in different countries) I often met with them and other sociologists, debated complex problems in the field of sociology of sport, and simply maintained friendly relations.

What domestic scientists were engaged in the study of the sociology of sport with you in the Soviet period?

During the Soviet period, a great many researchers were engaged in developing research questions in the sociology of sport. I would like to single out sociologists with whom I jointly developed sociological study programs and conducted these studies, wrote collective papers and published them in the Journal of the International Sociology of Sport Association. These are, for example, such sociologists as P.A. Vinogradov, A.M. Gendin, V.M. Labskir, R.A. Meyer. B.I. Novikov, M.I. Sergeev, A.N. Falaleev.

Was there any support from the Soviet government for the research on the sociology of sport at that time?

Yes, there was and it was very substantial.

What scientific works have you published in recent years and how are they related to the sociology of sport?

In the course of my career, I have published 16 monographs and textbooks in this area, as well as many research reports and journal articles. Here are the 5 most recent monographs:

How you would assess the current state of development in the sociology of sport?

Modern sociology of sport has accumulated huge empirical material from numerous sociological surveys of the population. However, the research methods used do not allow to effectively address the sociological problems of sport. This has been made evident in the difficulties of establishing the determinants of and barriers to physical culture and sports participation among the population, understanding the sociocultural significance of sport and of the modern Olympic movement, the relationship of sport and politics, etc.

Your News


"Sean" Tzu-hsuan Chen has won Taiwan's Excellent Journalism Award in the News Commentary category. This is the most prestigious journalism award in Taiwan, equivalent to the Pulitzer Prize in the USA. It is also the first time this award has been given to a sports column in Taiwan.

New Books

- This is the first book to offer in-depth analysis of the "Against Modern Football" movement through the comparison of two AMF clubs. The movement has emerged in opposition to the rampant commercialisation of football and the lack of supporters' influence over the governance of the clubs they support.

Drawing on long-term ethnographic research, the book examines the foundation, organisation and governance of new clubs set up by supporters as part of the AMF movement. Centred on detailed case studies of two clubs in particular—HFC Falke in Germany, founded in 2014, and Varteks Varaždin in Croatia, founded in 2011—the book explores supporter cultures and identity and considers the social processes at work in the foundation of new football clubs. By examining the unique local and national contexts in which HFC Falke and Varteks Varaždin have emerged, as well the broader international context that encompasses well-known AMF clubs such as FC United of Manchester, the book makes an important contribution to our understanding of supporters, their activism, the significance of football clubs, and social movements more broadly.


This book is fascinating reading for anybody with an interest in football, the sociology of sport, sport management, the politics of sport, social movements, subcultures, or ethnography.




- This is the first book to focus on participatory research in the context of sport and physical activity. It explores the transformative potential of participatory research methods and provides an introduction to the practicalities of doing participatory research in sport and physical activity.

The book is structured around phases of the research process, covering research design, data collection, data analysis, and knowledge mobilization and translation. Chapters cover research design topics such as building research partnerships, reflexivity and ethical issues; methods such as social photo-elicitation, go-along interviews, and biographical mapping; analytical approaches such as collective memory work and collaborative analysis; and knowledge mobilization and translation topics such as podcasting, digital tools, and peer review. Every chapter includes a review of key developments, a guide to how that approach can be employed, an example from the author's own work, and critical reflections on how that approach can shape future research and have an impact on public discourse.

This book is an invaluable resource for students and researchers working in sport studies, the sociology of sport, sport and exercise psychology, sport management and policy, and human movement and health studies more broadly. It will be particularly useful for those interested in diverse and inclusive approaches to qualitative research methodologies.

Special Issue - Leisure and Social Cohesion - of the [International Journal of the Sociology of Leisure](#)

Social cohesion, a fundamental sociological concept, seeks to understand how societies can collectively move towards shared goals. Despite its significance, the term remains ambiguously defined, often laden with assumptions and contradictions. Scholars have critiqued the broad nature of some definitions, the conflation with economic objectives, and the assumptions about values and metrics that best represent social cohesion.

In recent discourse, both popular and academic, the relationship between leisure and social cohesion has gained prominence. Policies and studies increasingly recognize social cohesion as a precursor to leisure participation, while leisure-based programs are viewed as potential tools to enhance social cohesion within communities. This intertwined relationship raises several questions: How is social cohesion conceptualized within local leisure programming? How do leisure-related policies define or operationalize social cohesion? How does leisure support social cohesion, and vice versa?

This Special Issue invites scholars to explore and clarify the relationship between leisure and social cohesion.

Potential topics for submission include, but are not limited to:

- Conceptualizations of social cohesion within leisure programming and policies
- Trends and developments in literature relating to leisure and social cohesion
- Critical evaluations of the assumptions surrounding leisure and social cohesion
- Studies on the impact of social cohesion on leisure participation
- The role of leisure-based programs (e.g., sports, recreation) in enhancing social cohesion
- Evaluations or case studies of specific leisure programs or organizations
- Historical perspectives on the evolution of leisure policies and programming

We encourage contributions that not only explore these themes but also engage critically with the concept of social cohesion itself, offering new insights and perspectives on how leisure and social cohesion intersect and influence one another.

Authors are invited to submit original research articles, review articles, and theoretical papers. Submissions should be between 5,000 and 8,000 words (excluding references) and should follow the journal's formatting guidelines. More information can be found [here](#).
